1 AN ACT concerning

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City of Annapolis - Alcoholic Beverages - Beer and Wine Festival License

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing in the City of Annapolis the Alcoholic Beverage

- 4 Control Board to issue a special festival (ABWF) (AWF) license for beer and wine
- 5 festivals; establishing certain requirements for license applicants and for
- 6 holders of special festival licenses; establishing the scope of the license; placing
- 7 certain restrictions on the way beer and wine are is sold and displayed;
- 8 establishing the time and location of and other requirements for beer and wine
- 9 festivals; authorizing certain agreements between holders of certain licenses;
- 10 defining a certain term; making this Act an emergency measure; providing for
- 11 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to beer and wine festivals in
- 12 the City of Annapolis.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

21 8-301.1.

22 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FESTIVAL" MEANS THE CITY OF ANNAPOLIS BEER AND 23 WINE FESTIVAL.

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1 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN THE CITY OF ANNAPOLIS.

2 (C) THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD MAY ISSUE A SPECIAL 3 FESTIVAL (ABWF) (AWF) LICENSE.

4 (D) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, AN
5 APPLICANT FOR A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE SHALL BE A HOLDER OF AN EXISTING
6 STATE RETAIL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE, STATE CLASS 3 WINERY LICENSE,
7 OR STATE CLASS 4 LIMITED WINERY LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

8 (E) A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSEE SHALL÷

9 (1) ONLY DISPLAY AND SELL÷

10 (I) WINE :

12 1. <u>(I)</u> MANUFACTURED AND PROCESSED IN ANY STATE;

132.(II)PRICE FILED IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS14ADOPTED BY THE COMPTROLLER; AND

153.(III)DISTRIBUTED IN THE STATE AT THE TIME THE16 APPLICATION IS FILED; AND

17 (II) BEER THAT IS BREWED BY A BREWER:

181.WHO BREWS LESS THAN 60,000 BARRELS OF BEER19 ANNUALLY; AND.

202.WHOSE PRODUCT IS DISTRIBUTED IN THE STATE AT THE21TIME THE APPLICATION IS FILED;

(2) DISPLAY AND SELL BEER AND WINE AT RETAIL FOR CONSUMPTION
ON OR OFF THE LICENSED PREMISES ON THE DAYS AND FOR THE HOURS
DESIGNATED FOR THE FESTIVAL; AND

(3) DISPLAY AND SELL WINE THAT IS MANUFACTURED AND PROCESSED
IN ANY STATE AT RETAIL FOR CONSUMPTION OFF THE LICENSED PREMISES ON THE
DAYS AND FOR THE HOURS DESIGNATED FOR THE FESTIVAL.

28 (F) THIS SECTION DOES NOT PROHIBIT THE HOLDER OF A SPECIAL FESTIVAL
29 LICENSE FROM HOLDING ANOTHER ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE OF A
30 DIFFERENT CLASS OR NATURE.

31 (G) THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD:

32 (1) MAY ESTABLISH THE LICENSE FEE;

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(2) MAY SELECT ONE WEEKEND, FRIDAY THROUGH SUNDAY INCLUSIVE,
 ANNUALLY FOR THE FESTIVAL PROVIDED THAT THE WEEKEND THAT IS SELECTED
 DOES NOT OCCUR WITHIN 14 DAYS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE MARYLAND WINE
 FESTIVAL;

5 (3) SHALL CHOOSE A LOCATION IN THE CITY OF ANNAPOLIS FOR THIS6 FESTIVAL THAT IS NOT LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE; AND

7 (4) SHALL ASSURE THAT THE PRIMARY FOCUS OF THE FESTIVAL IS THE 8 PROMOTION OF MARYLAND BEER AND WINE.

9 (H) (1) PRODUCTS DISPLAYED AND SOLD SHALL BE:

10 (I) INVOICED TO THE FESTIVAL LICENSE HOLDER BY A LICENSED 11 STATE WHOLESALER, WINERY, OR LIMITED WINERY; AND

12 (II) DELIVERED TO THE FESTIVAL FROM THE LICENSED PREMISES 13 OF THE WHOLESALER, WINERY, OR LIMITED WINERY.

(2) WHENEVER A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE IS ISSUED UNDER THIS
 SECTION, HOLDERS OF WHOLESALE, WINERY, OR LIMITED WINERY LICENSES MAY
 ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE HOLDER OF A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE
 TO DELIVER BEER AND WINE 2 DAYS PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE, AND TO
 ACCEPT RETURNS 2 DAYS AFTER THE EXPIRATION DATE, OF THE SPECIAL FESTIVAL
 LICENSE.

20 (I) THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD SHALL ADOPT 21 REGULATIONS FOR CARRYING OUT THIS SECTION.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

23 June 1, 2001 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of

24 the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by

25 three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General

26 Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for

27 <u>a period of 2 years from June 1, 2001 and, at the end of May 31, 2003, with no further</u> 28 action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further

29 <u>force and effect</u>.

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
