3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the provisions of the Maryland Uniform Electronic

4 Transactions Act from modifying, limiting, or superseding certain provisions of

- 5 the federal Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act;
- 6 exempting certain notices of product recall or material failure of a product,
- 7 certain documents that accompany toxic or dangerous materials, and
- 8 transactions governed by certain laws governing family law from the Maryland
- 9 Uniform Electronic Transactions Act; repealing provisions of the Maryland
- 10 Uniform Electronic Transactions Act that exempt certain records from the scope
- 11 of the Act and allow governmental agencies to adopt certain regulations;
- 12 defining certain terms; specifying that the provisions of this Act are intended by
- 13 the General Assembly to be consistent with a certain federal act; and generally
- 14 relating to the scope of the Maryland Uniform Electronic Transactions Act.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 federal Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act.
