26 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THE 27 MEMBERS.

28 (D) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY.

29 (E) THE STAFF FOR THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE EXECUTIVE30 BRANCH AS DIRECTED BY THE GOVERNOR.
