6 (b) [In] BEGINNING IN THE YEAR 2004, IN Baltimore City, there shall be a

7 general election for municipal offices on the [Tuesday following the first Monday in

8 November in the year following the election of the Governor] SAME DAY AS THE

9 GENERAL ELECTION FOR PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2001.
