A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - Salaries of Officials**

3 FOR the purpose of altering in Baltimore City the salaries of the executive secretary
4 and the deputy executive secretary of the Board of Liquor License
5 Commissioners; and generally relating to the salaries of officials of the
6 Baltimore City Board of Liquor License Commissioners.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
8 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
9 Section 15-109(d)
10 Annotated Code of Maryland
11 (1998 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

15 15-109.

16 (d) In Baltimore City:

17 (1) The chairman of the Board shall receive an annual salary of \$18,500,
18 and the other members of the Board shall receive an annual salary of \$18,000.

19 (2) The Board shall appoint an executive secretary and a deputy
20 executive secretary whose salaries shall be [fixed by the Board, subject to approval by
21 the State Comptroller] AS FOLLOWS:

22 (I) FOR THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, A SALARY COMPARABLE TO
23 THE SALARY OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BOARD OF MUNICIPAL AND
24 ZONING APPEALS; AND

25 (II) FOR THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, A SALARY AT ONE
26 PAY GRADE BELOW THAT OF THE SALARY OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE
27 BOARD OF LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.

1 (3) The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary shall be
2 residents of Baltimore City and of high character and integrity.

3 (4) The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary shall be
4 appointed upon the basis of their executive skill and ability and once appointed shall
5 hold office during good behavior regardless of changes in members constituting the
6 Board. They shall be removed only for incompetency or immorality upon charges
7 furnished in writing by the Board setting forth the grounds for dismissal and after
8 opportunity for hearing.

9 (5) Either the executive secretary or the deputy executive secretary shall
10 be a member of the Bar of this State.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2001.
