- 3 FOR the purpose of reinstating a statutory veto previously granted the licensed
- 4 clinical marriage and family therapist member of the State Board of



1 A LICENSED GRADUATE MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST 2 WORKING UNDER SUPERVISION IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 17-3A-06(C) OF THIS 3 SUBTITLE. 4 (b) Unless an individual is licensed to practice clinical alcohol and drug 5 counseling, clinical marriage and family therapy, or clinical professional counseling, 6 an individual may not: 7 Represent to the public by title, by description of services, methods, (1) 8 or procedures, or otherwise, that the individual is licensed by the Board to provide 9 clinical alcohol and drug counseling services, clinical marriage and family therapy 10 services, or clinical professional counseling services in the State; 11 (2) Use any title, abbreviation, sign, card, or other representation that 12 the individual is a licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselor, licensed clinical 13 marriage and family therapist, LICENSED GRADUATE MARRIAGE AND FAMILY 14 THERAPIST, [or] licensed clinical professional counselor, OR LICENSED GRADUATE 15 PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR; or Use the title "L.C.A.D.C.", "L.C.M.F.T.", "L.G.M.F.T.", [or] "L.C.P.C.", 16 17 OR "L.G.P.C.", or the words "licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselor", "licensed 18 clinical marriage and family therapist", "LICENSED GRADUATE MARRIAGE AND 19 FAMILY THERAPIST", [or] "licensed clinical professional counselor", OR "LICENSED 20 GRADUATE PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR" with the intent to represent that the 21 individual practices clinical alcohol and drug counseling, clinical marriage and family 22 therapy, or clinical professional counseling. 23 Any individual who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a (c) (1) 24 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500 or 25 imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or both. 26 (2) Each violation of this section is a separate offense. 27 This subtitle may not be construed to limit the scope of practice of any (d) 28 individual who is duly licensed under this article.
