- 4 FOR the purpose of excepting Caroline County from the counties in which an
- alcoholic beverages law enforcement or licensing authority may not proceed
- 6 against a licensee when the licensee or an employee of the licensee has been
- found not guilty or given probation without a verdict in a criminal proceeding for
- 8 selling alcoholic beverages to a minor or an intoxicated person; excepting
- 9 Caroline County from the counties in which a certain bail bond prohibition and
- 10 a certain defense apply in a criminal proceeding against a licensee or employee
- for selling alcoholic beverages to a minor or an intoxicated person; establishing
- that in Caroline County the granting of probation before judgment to a licensee
- or employee for selling alcoholic beverages to a minor or an intoxicated person
- does not bar the Board of License Commissioners from proceeding
- administratively against the licensee for the violation; making this Act an
- emergency measure; and generally relating to disciplinary proceedings in

## SENATE BILL 553 1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 12-108. 3 (a) (1) A licensee licensed under this article, or any employee of the licensee, 4 may not sell or furnish any alcoholic beverages at any time to a person under 21 years 5 of age: 6 (i) For the underage person's own use or for the use of any other 7 person; or 8 To any person who, at the time of the sale, or delivery, is visibly (ii) 9 under the influence of any alcoholic beverage. 10 (2) Any licensee or any employee of the licensee who is charged with a 11 violation of this subsection shall receive a summons to appear in court on a certain 12 day to answer the charges placed against that person. The person charged may not be 13 required to post bail bond pending trial in any court of this State. 14 A licensee or employee of the licensee violating any of the 15 provisions of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, suffers 16 the penalties provided by § 16-503 of this article. 17 A licensee or employee of the licensee who is charged with 18 selling or furnishing any alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 years of age may 19 not be found guilty of a violation of this subsection, if the person establishes to the 20 satisfaction of the jury or the court sitting as a jury that the person used due caution 21 to establish that the person under 21 years of age was not, in fact, a person under 21 22 years of age if a nonresident of the State. 23 If the person is a resident of the State of Maryland, the licensee (iii) 24 or employee of the licensee may accept, as proof of a person's age, the display of the 25 person's driver's license or identification card as provided for in the Maryland Vehicle 26 Law. 27 Except as otherwise provided in this section, if any licensee or (iv) 28 employee of the licensee is found not guilty, or placed on probation without a verdict, 29 of any alleged violation of this subsection, this finding operates as a complete bar to 30 any proceeding by any alcoholic beverage law enforcement or licensing authorities 31 against the licensee on account of the alleged violation.

4 (2) A licensee under the provisions of this article, or any of the licensee's 5 employees, may not sell or furnish any alcoholic beverages at any time to a person 6 under 21 years of age, either for that person's own use or for the use of any other 7 person, or to any person who, at the time of such sale or delivery, is visibly under the 8 influence of any alcoholic beverage.						
9 (5) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section do not apply to the 10 counties which are listed in paragraph (1) of this subsection and the law in these 11 counties shall remain in the same force and effect as if not amended by this section.

20 (2) The granting of probation before judgment to a licensee or employee 21 of the licensee for violating subsection (a) OR (C) of this section does not bar the Board 22 of License Commissioners from proceeding administratively against the licensee for 23 the violation.						

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 28 the date it is enacted.
