- 3 (i) The Administration may acquire, construct, reconstruct, rehabilitate,
- 4 improve, maintain, lease as lessor or as lessee, repair, and operate either directly or
- 5 through State created private operating companies port facilities within its territorial
- 6 jurisdiction, including the dredging of ship channels and turning basins and the
- 7 filling and grading of land.

- 9 Under the authority granted by § 6-204(i) of this article, the Maryland Port
- 10 Administration [shall] MAY operate and maintain the port facility presently under
- 11 its jurisdiction at Cambridge, Maryland. The operation and maintenance may include
- 12 the leasing of the facility. The Maryland Port Administration may expend the
- 13 necessary funds for the development of the port facility at Cambridge. THE
