CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority - Community**
3 **Colleges - Tax Exempt Financing**

4 FOR the purpose of modifying a certain defined term under the Maryland Health and
5 Higher Educational Facilities Authority (MHHEFA) Act to provide that it
6 includes certain community colleges; authorizing the boards of trustees of
7 certain community colleges to finance or refinance the costs of certain projects
8 by entering into a certain type of agreement with MHHEFA; requiring the board
9 of trustees and the governing body of each county that supports the community
10 college to adopt a certain type of resolution before the board of trustees issues a
11 note or other evidence of obligation pursuant to an agreement with MHHEFA;
12 providing that a resolution adopted by a board of trustees or governing body
13 under this Act is not subject to procedures required for legislative acts or to
14 referendum; providing that an agreement with MHHEFA may include certain
15 provisions; providing that the principal amount of a note or other evidence of
16 obligation issued under this Act, the interest payable on the note or other
17 evidence of obligation, the transfer of the note or other evidence of obligation,
18 and any income derived from the transfer of a note or other evidence of
19 obligation is exempt from taxation by the State and any county or municipality
20 in the State; providing that a note or other evidence of obligation issued under
21 this Act does not create or constitute a debt or obligation of the State or any
22 county or municipality of the State, does not constitute a debt of the General
23 Assembly, and does not pledge the faith and credit of the State; requiring the
24 State Comptroller, at MHHEFA's request, to withhold certain funds due to a
25 board of trustees and deposit the withheld funds to the credit of a certain
26 sinking fund; and generally relating to MHHEFA and community colleges.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article 43C - Maryland Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority**

13 3.

14 As used in this article, the following words and terms shall have the following
15 meanings unless the context indicates another or different meaning or intent:

16 (f) (1) (I) "Institution for higher education" shall mean an educational
17 institution situated within the State which by virtue of law or charter is a public or
18 other nonprofit educational institution empowered to provide a program of education
19 beyond the high school level and awards a bachelor's or advanced degree or provides
20 a program of not less than two (2) years' duration which is accepted for full credit
21 toward a bachelor's degree, and which meets the standards, rules and regulations
22 prescribed by the Maryland Higher Education Commission and is thereby empowered
23 to issue a certificate, diploma or degree pursuant to Title 12 of the Education Article
24 of the Maryland Code. [This] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS
25 PARAGRAPH, THIS term shall not mean any institution owned and operated by the
26 State.

27 (II) "INSTITUTION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION" INCLUDES:

28 1. A COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR WHICH A BOARD OF
29 COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEES IS ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-101 OF THE
30 EDUCATION ARTICLE;

31 2. A REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE ESTABLISHED UNDER
32 § 16-202 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE;

33 3. THE BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
34 ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-501 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE; AND

35 4. THE COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN MARYLAND ESTABLISHED
36 UNDER § 16-603 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.

Article - Education

16-302.1.

(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(2) "AUTHORITY" MEANS THE MARYLAND HEALTH AND HIGHER EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED UNDER ARTICLE 43C OF THE CODE.

(3) "BOARD" MEANS:

(I) A BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEES ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-101 OF THIS ARTICLE;

(II) A BOARD OF REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEES ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-202 OF THIS ARTICLE;

(III) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-504 OF THIS ARTICLE; AND

(IV) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN MARYLAND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 16-604 OF THIS ARTICLE.

(4) "COST" MEANS THE COST OF:

(I) ACQUISITION OF A PROJECT OR ANY INTEREST IN A PROJECT;

(II) INSTALLATION OF A PROJECT, INCLUDING ANY DEMOLITION, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, OR RENOVATION DIRECTLY RELATED TO A PROJECT;

(III) FINANCING CHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH A PROJECT;

(IV) INTEREST BEFORE AND DURING ACQUISITION OF A PROJECT AND, IF DEEMED ADVISABLE BY THE BOARD, FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO 1 YEAR AFTER COMPLETION OF ACQUISITION OF A PROJECT;

(V) INTEREST AND RESERVES FOR PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST AND FOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF A PROJECT;

(VI) ARCHITECTURAL, ENGINEERING, FINANCIAL, AND LEGAL SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH A PROJECT;

(VII) PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, STUDIES, SURVEYS, AND ESTIMATES OF COSTS AND REVENUES FOR A PROJECT;

(VIII) ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES NECESSARY OR INCIDENT TO DETERMINING THE FEASIBILITY OR PRACTICABILITY OF A PROJECT; AND

1 (IX) OTHER EXPENSES THAT ARE NECESSARY OR INCIDENT TO THE
2 ACQUISITION OF A PROJECT, THE FINANCING OR REFINANCING OF THE
3 ACQUISITION OF A PROJECT, AND THE PLACING OF A PROJECT IN OPERATION.

4 (5) "GOVERNING BODY" MEANS:

5 (I) THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF A COUNTY WITH A CHARTER FORM
6 OF GOVERNMENT ESTABLISHED UNDER ARTICLE XI-A OF THE MARYLAND
7 CONSTITUTION; OR

8 (II) THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ANY OTHER
9 COUNTY.

10 (6) "NOTE" MEANS A NOTE, BOND, LEASE, PURCHASE AGREEMENT, OR
11 OTHER EVIDENCE OF OBLIGATION.

12 (7) (I) "PROJECT" MEANS EQUIPMENT, MACHINERY, AND OTHER
13 PERSONAL PROPERTY, WHETHER OR NOT IN THE NATURE OF FIXTURES, ESSENTIAL
14 OR CONVENIENT FOR THE OPERATION OF A COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

15 (II) "PROJECT" INCLUDES LICENSES AND OTHER RIGHTS ACQUIRED
16 BY A BOARD FOR THE USE OF EQUIPMENT, MACHINERY, AND OTHER PERSONAL
17 PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.

18 (B) A BOARD MAY FINANCE OR REFINANCE THE COSTS OF A PROJECT BY
19 ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE AUTHORITY THAT IS EVIDENCED BY A
20 NOTE OR NOTES ISSUED BY THE BOARD IF, PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF ANY NOTE,
21 THE BOARD AND THE GOVERNING BODY OF EACH COUNTY THAT SUPPORTS A
22 COMMUNITY COLLEGE GOVERNED BY THE BOARD ADOPTS A RESOLUTION THAT
23 MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

24 (C) (1) PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF ANY NOTE UNDER THIS SECTION, A
25 BOARD AND THE GOVERNING BODY OF EACH COUNTY THAT SUPPORTS A
26 COMMUNITY COLLEGE GOVERNED BY THE BOARD SHALL EACH ADOPT A
27 RESOLUTION THAT AUTHORIZES THE BOARD TO FINANCE OR REFINANCE THE COSTS
28 OF A PROJECT BY ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE AUTHORITY.

29 (2) THE RESOLUTION SHALL:

30 (I) GENERALLY DESCRIBE THE PROJECT TO BE FINANCED OR
31 REFINANCED;

32 (II) SPECIFY THE MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF
33 ANY NOTE ISSUED PURSUANT TO THE AGREEMENT; AND

34 (III) IMPOSE ANY TERMS OR CONDITIONS ON THE ISSUANCE OF A
35 NOTE THAT THE BOARD OR GOVERNING BODY DEEMS APPROPRIATE.

36 (3) A RESOLUTION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IS
37 ADMINISTRATIVE IN NATURE AND NOT SUBJECT TO:

1 (I) PROCEDURES REQUIRED FOR LEGISLATIVE ACTS; OR

2 (II) REFERENDUM.

3 (D) (1) A BOARD MAY ENTER INTO ANY AGREEMENT NECESSARY OR
4 APPROPRIATE IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF ANY NOTE, INCLUDING AN
5 AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE:

6 (I) ADDITIONAL CREDIT OR LIQUIDITY SUPPORT FOR A NOTE OR A
7 BOND ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY ON ITS BEHALF; AND

8 (II) A FIXED INTEREST RATE OR MAXIMUM INTEREST RATE FOR A
9 VARIABLE RATE NOTE OR A BOND ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY ON ITS BEHALF.

10 (2) IF THE BOARD ENTERS INTO AN AGREEMENT AUTHORIZED UNDER
11 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE AGREEMENT MAY INCLUDE PROVISIONS
12 THAT:

13 (I) GRANT A SECURITY INTEREST IN A PROJECT FOR WHICH A
14 NOTE IS ISSUED OR PLEDGE ALL OR PART OF THE FEES, CHARGES, AND OTHER
15 REVENUES RECEIVED FROM OR IN CONNECTION WITH A PROJECT TO THE PAYMENT
16 OF A NOTE;

17 (II) ALLOW FOR THE INVESTMENT AND REINVESTMENT OF THE
18 PROCEEDS OF A NOTE UNTIL THE PROCEEDS ARE USED FOR THE PURPOSES FOR
19 WHICH THE NOTE WAS ISSUED;

20 (III) GOVERN THE DISPOSITION OF ANY EXCESS PROCEEDS AND
21 THE INVESTMENT EARNINGS ON ANY EXCESS PROCEEDS; AND

22 (IV) REQUIRE THAT THE BOARD OPERATE AND MAINTAIN ALL OR A
23 PORTION OF THE PROJECT REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE FEES, CHARGES, AND
24 OTHER REVENUES RECEIVED FROM OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROJECT ARE
25 SUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COST OF OPERATING OR MAINTAINING ALL OR A
26 PORTION OF THE PROJECT.

27 (E) (1) THE BOARD SHALL SPECIFY OR AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN OR
28 OTHER MEMBER OF THE BOARD TO SPECIFY:

29 (I) THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF A NOTE;

30 (II) THE RATE OR RATES OF INTEREST PAYABLE ON A NOTE OR THE
31 METHOD OF DETERMINING THE RATE OR RATES OF INTEREST PAYABLE ON A NOTE;

32 (III) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DATE
33 OF MATURITY OF A NOTE, THE PAYMENT PROVISIONS OF A NOTE, AND THE
34 OPTIONAL AND MANDATORY PREPAYMENT PROVISIONS OF A NOTE, INCLUDING ANY
35 MANDATORY SINKING FUND INSTALLMENTS FOR THE NOTE; AND

1 (IV) OTHER MATTERS, DETAILS, FORMS, DOCUMENTS, AND
2 PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE AUTHORIZATION, ISSUANCE, EXECUTION, SALE,
3 DELIVERY, AND PAYMENT OF A NOTE AND THE SECURITY FOR A NOTE.

4 (2) THE DATE OF MATURITY FOR A NOTE MAY NOT EXCEED THE USEFUL
5 LIFE OF THE PROJECT FOR WHICH THE NOTE IS ISSUED.

6 (F) (1) A NOTE SHALL BE EXECUTED ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD BY THE
7 MANUAL OR FACSIMILE SIGNATURE OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OR OTHER
8 MEMBER OF THE BOARD AUTHORIZED BY RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD.

9 (2) IF THE INDIVIDUAL WHOSE SIGNATURE OR COUNTERSIGNATURE
10 APPEARS ON A NOTE CEASES TO BE A MEMBER OF THE BOARD BEFORE DELIVERY OF
11 THE NOTE, THE INDIVIDUAL'S SIGNATURE OR COUNTERSIGNATURE SHALL BE VALID
12 AND SUFFICIENT FOR ALL PURPOSES THE SAME AS IF THE INDIVIDUAL HAD
13 REMAINED A MEMBER OF THE BOARD UNTIL DELIVERY.

14 (G) THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF A NOTE, THE INTEREST PAYABLE ON A NOTE,
15 THE TRANSFER OF A NOTE, AND ANY INCOME DERIVED FROM THE TRANSFER OF A
16 NOTE, INCLUDING ANY PROFIT MADE ON THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF A NOTE, SHALL
17 BE EXEMPT FROM TAXATION BY THE STATE AND ANY COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IN
18 THE STATE.

19 (H) A NOTE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION DOES NOT CREATE OR CONSTITUTE
20 A DEBT OR OBLIGATION OF THE STATE OR ANY COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IN THE
21 STATE AND DOES NOT CONSTITUTE A DEBT OR OBLIGATION OF THE GENERAL
22 ASSEMBLY OR PLEDGE THE FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE STATE WITHIN THE MEANING
23 OF ARTICLE III, § 34 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.

24 (I) IF REQUESTED BY THE AUTHORITY, THE STATE COMPTROLLER SHALL
25 WITHHOLD FROM ANY INSTALLMENT DUE THE BOARD FROM THE STATE'S GENERAL
26 FUND APPROPRIATION MONEYS FOR DEPOSIT TO THE CREDIT OF A SINKING FUND
27 MAINTAINED TO PAY A NOTE IN AN AMOUNT UP TO THE TOTAL AMOUNT PAYABLE ON
28 THE NOTE AND ANY AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS
29 SECTION IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AND THE NEXT SUCCEEDING FISCAL YEAR.

30 (J) THIS SECTION PROVIDES ADDITIONAL, ALTERNATIVE, AND
31 SUPPLEMENTAL AUTHORITY IN RELATION TO POWERS CONFERRED UPON A BOARD
32 UNDER ANY OTHER EXISTING LAW AND MAY NOT BE REGARDED AS IN DEROGATION
33 OF OR AS A LIMITATION TO ANY EXISTING POWER OF A BOARD.

34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
35 October 1, 2001.
