SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
13 Article - Business Occupations and Professions
14 2-308.
15 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may waive any 16 examination requirement of this subtitle for:
17 (1) a certified public accountant licensed by another state; or
18 (2) the holder of a license, certificate, or degree that is issued by another 19 country and is recognized as authority for the holder to practice public accountancy in 20 that country in a manner comparable to practicing certified public accountancy in 21 this State.

- 1 (b) The Board may grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant: 2 (1) is of good character and reputation; 3 (2) is at least 18 years of age; 4 (3) pays to the Board an application fee of \$50; and 5 provides adequate evidence that, at the time the applicant was (4) 6 licensed by the other state or country, the applicant met educational, examination, and experience requirements that were substantially equivalent to those then 8 required by the laws of this State; or 9 (ii) has [practiced full time] BEEN LICENSED as a certified public
- 10 accountant in accordance with subsection (a)(1) or (2) of this section for [5] 4 out of
- 11 the last 10 years immediately preceding submission of the application and has passed
- 12 the Uniform Public Accountancy Examination AFTER PASSING THE UNIFORM PUBLIC
- 13 ACCOUNTANCY EXAMINATION, HAS OBTAINED, OUTSIDE OF THIS STATE, 4 YEARS OF
- 14 PRACTICAL WORK EXPERIENCE, AS DEFINED IN § 2-302(F) OF THIS SUBTITLE, WITHIN
- 15 THE LAST 10 YEARS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Public 16
- 17 Accountancy shall adopt regulations to implement this Act.
- 18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 October June 1, 2001.
