- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 **Article - Education**
- 15 4-108.
- Each county board shall: 16 (A)
- To the best of its ability carry out the applicable provisions of this 17 (1)
- 18 article and the bylaws, rules, regulations, and policies of the State Board;
- 19 Maintain throughout its county a reasonably uniform system of
- 20 public schools that is designed to provide quality education and equal educational
- 21 opportunity for all children;
- 22 Subject to this article and to the applicable bylaws, rules, and
- 23 regulations of the State Board, determine, with the advice of the county
- 24 superintendent, the educational policies of the county school system; and
- 25 Adopt, codify, and make available to the public bylaws, rules, and
- 26 regulations not inconsistent with State law, for the conduct and management of the
- 27 county public schools.

4	(1) THE NATIONAL MOTTO;
5	(2) THE NATIONAL ANTHEM;
6	(3) THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE;
7	(4) THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE;
8 9	(5) WRITINGS, SPEECHES, DOCUMENTS, AND PROCLAMATIONS OF THE FOUNDING FATHERS OR PRESIDENTS OF THE UNITED STATES; OR
10	(6) ARTICLE 36 OF THE MARYLAND DECLARATION OF RIGHTS.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 July 1, 2001.
