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## 2 Education - Public Schools - Character Education

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a county board of education to establish a certain
- 4 program of character education; requiring a character education program to be

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (A) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO INSTILL IN STUDENTS CIVIC
- 22 VIRTUES AND PERSONAL CHARACTER TRAITS SO AS TO IMPROVE THE LEARNING
- 23 ENVIRONMENT, PROMOTE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT, REDUCE DISCIPLINARY
- 24 PROBLEMS, AND DEVELOP CIVIC-MINDED STUDENTS OF HIGH CHARACTER.
- 25 (B) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A PROGRAM OF CHARACTER
- 26 EDUCATION, WHICH SHALL BE REQUIRED TO BE TAUGHT IN ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN
- 27 THE COUNTY.

- 1 (C) THE COMPONENTS OF EACH CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAM 2 ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE DEVELOPED IN COOPERATION WITH

- 10 (3) RESPONSIBILITY, INCLUDING HARD WORK, ECONOMIC
- 11 SELF-RELIANCE, ACCOUNTABILITY, DILIGENCE, PERSEVERANCE, AND
- 12 SELF-CONTROL;
- 13 (4) FAIRNESS, INCLUDING JUSTICE, CONSEQUENCES OF BAD BEHAVIOR,
- 14 PRINCIPLES OF NONDISCRIMINATION, AND FREEDOM FROM PREJUDICE;
- 15 CARING, INCLUDING KINDNESS, EMPATHY, COMPASSION,
- 16 CONSIDERATION, GENEROSITY, AND CHARITY; AND
- 17 (6) CITIZENSHIP, INCLUDING PATRIOTISM, THE PLEDGE OF
- 18 ALLEGIANCE, RESPECT FOR THE AMERICAN FLAG, CONCERN FOR THE COMMON
- 19 GOOD, RESPECT FOR AUTHORITY AND THE LAW, AND COMMUNITY-MINDEDNESS.
- 20 (E) THE STATE BOARD SHALL:
- 21 (1) ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS
- 22 CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION;
- 23 (2) PROVIDE RESOURCES AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COUNTY
- 24 BOARDS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS;
- 25 (3) REVIEW AND ANALYZE THE CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS
- 26 ESTABLISHED BY THE COUNTY BOARDS AND BY JURISDICTIONS IN OTHER STATES;
- 27 (4) IDENTIFY EFFECTIVE CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND
- 28 PRACTICES;
- 29 (5) DISSEMINATE INFORMATION TO THE COUNTY BOARDS REGARDING:
- 30 (I) EFFECTIVE CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND
- 31 PRACTICES; AND
- 32 (II) POTENTIAL FUNDING AND SUPPORT SOURCES FOR CHARACTER
- 33 EDUCATION PROGRAMS; AND

- 1 (6) AWARD GRANTS TO COUNTY BOARDS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
- 2 INNOVATIVE CHARACTER EDUCATION PROGRAMS, WITH SUCH FUNDS AS ARE
- 3 APPROPRIATED FOR THIS PURPOSE.
- 4 (F) THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO REQUIRE OR AUTHORIZE
- 5 THE INDOCTRINATION OF STUDENTS IN ANY PARTICULAR RELIGIOUS OR POLITICAL
- 6 BELIEF.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 8 October 1, 2001.
