12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (a) Beginning July 1, 2001, notwithstanding § 9-120 of the State Government

17 Article and subject to subsection (b) of this section, [an excess amount of] lottery

18 funds [from the prior fiscal year] that would otherwise be distributed to the General

19 Fund under § 9-120(b)(1)(ii) of the State Government Article shall be credited to the

20 Special Fund established under § 11-401 of this article if[:

21 (1) the excess amount of funds results from cumulative distributions for

22 the prior fiscal year to the General Fund under § 9-120(b)(1)(ii) of the State

23 Government Article exceeding the last official estimate of the Board of Revenue

24 estimates for that year; and

25 (2)] payments are made to the Racing Facility Redevelopment Bond Fund 26 under § 11-803 of this title.

27 (b) The [excess amount of] LOTTERY funds shall be credited only in the 28 amount of the payment to the Racing Facility Redevelopment Bond Fund under §

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1 11-803 of this title less the amount of any repayment to the Commission by the

2 Corporation under § 11-1206(d) of this subtitle.

3 [(c) If excess lottery revenues from the prior fiscal year do not provide funds in

4 an amount sufficient to fully credit the Special Fund as required under this section,5 the Governor may request a deficiency appropriation during the next legislative

6 session.]

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 8 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, 9 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 10 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 11 the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through June 30, 2003, and, at the end 12 of June 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 13 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
