BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 83B - Department of Housing and Community Development 16 17 1-205. The Secretary is responsible for the budget of the office and for the budgets 18 (a)

19 of the other boards, offices, and agencies within the jurisdiction of the Department.

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1 (b) (1) The Secretary shall be responsible for adopting regulations for the 2 office. [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS 3 4 SUBSECTION, THE Secretary shall review and shall have the power to approve or 5 disapprove or revise the regulations of all of the boards, offices, agencies, 6 commissions, etc. within the jurisdiction of the Department. 7 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS 8 PARAGRAPH. THE SECRETARY MAY NOT DISAPPROVE OR REVISE REGULATIONS OF 9 THE COMMISSION ON INDIAN AFFAIRS. THE SECRETARY MAY DISAPPROVE OR REVISE REGULATIONS 10 (II)11 OF THE COMMISSION ON INDIAN AFFAIRS THAT HAVE A FISCAL IMPACT. The Secretary shall have a seal for purposes of authentication of copies of 13 records or papers in the Secretary's office. 14 The Secretary shall be responsible for the coordination and direction (d) (1) 15 of all planning facilities initiated by the Secretary. In addition, the Secretary shall keep fully apprised of plans, 16 17 proposals, and projects of the Department and other agencies or units within the 18 jurisdiction of the Department and may approve, disapprove, or modify any such plan, 19 proposal, or project. 20 Wherever it is provided by law that an appointment to a particular office 21 within the Department is to be made by the Secretary with the approval of the 22 Governor, and the appointee is to serve at the pleasure of the Secretary, the Secretary 23 may not remove the appointee without first obtaining the approval of the Governor. 24 (f) In addition to the meetings of any board or commission within the 25 Department which are provided for by law or are called by the chairman thereof, the 26 Secretary may, whenever appropriate, call a meeting of such boards or commissions 27 for the consideration of any subject which the Secretary considers necessary and 28 proper. 29 The Secretary may exercise or perform any power, duty, responsibility, or (g) 30 function assigned to any of the administrations, boards, commissions, offices, 31 authorities, divisions, or other agencies within the jurisdiction of the Department. 32 All divisions, commissions, boards, offices, authorities, and other agencies 33 of the Department shall report to the Secretary or the Secretary's designee as 34 provided in regulations or written directives promulgated by the Secretary.

The Commission on Indian Affairs is an agency [in] WITHIN the Department. In

3	(1) Initiate, direct, and coordinate projects which further the understanding of Indian history and culture;
5 6	(2) Conduct a survey of historic buildings, sites, artifacts, archives and repositories, and publish and disseminate these findings and information;
9 10	(3) Undertake a comprehensive study of indigenous American Indian tribes including but not limited to the Crees, Creeks, Cherokees, Chippewas, Choptanks, Delawares, Haliwas, Lumbees, Nanticokes, Piscataways, Potomacs, Rappahannocks, Seminoles, Susquehannas, and Wicomicos, and their influence upon Maryland history and culture;
12 13	(4) Study the status of all Indian groups, tribes and communities in the State and assist them in obtaining recognition from the federal government;
14 15	(5) Study the economic and social needs of Indians in Maryland and make recommendations for the alleviation of these needs;
	(6) Locate, preserve and disseminate information to the public about significant buildings and sites relating to Indian history and culture, respectively; [and]
19 20	(7) Publish an annual report and any other material it deems necessary; AND
21 22	(8) ESTABLISH REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 2 SUBTITLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
