13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (d) (1) (i) Each associate judge of the Court of Baltimore City shall receive
18 an annual compensation of \$50,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual
19 compensation of \$60,000.

20 (ii) Each associate judge who was in active service on or after

21 January 1, [1981] 1984 shall be paid after the termination of active service, if he is

22 then at least 60 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or

23 salary calculated at the rate of [\$1,500] \$2,500 annually for each year, or a part of a

24 year, of active service; but the maximum pension or salary for the service by an

25 associate judge may not exceed [\$15,000] \$25,000 annually. Each Chief Judge who

26 was in active service on or after January 1, [1981] 1984, shall be paid, after the

27 termination of active service, if he is then at least 60 years of age or when he shall 28 attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary calculated at the rate of [\$1,525] \$3,000

29 annually for each year, or a part of a year of active service, but the maximum pension

1 or salary for the service by a Chief Judge may not exceed [\$15,250] \$30,000 annually.

2 The pension or salary shall be paid by the City of Baltimore in the same manner as

3 the salaries of the judges of the Court for the City are paid.

4 (2) The surviving spouse of every elected judge of the Court of Baltimore

5 City shall be paid one half of the pension to which his spouse was entitled at the time

6 of his death, or would have become entitled to by reason of attaining 60 years of age.

7 In each instance, the pension shall be paid to the spouse until remarriage or death.

8 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply in the case of a spouse who was

9 married to a sitting judge for a period of less than three years prior to his death, and

 $10\;$ to a retired judge for a period less than three years before his retirement.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2001.
