- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring that a certain budget be sufficient to fund certain
- 5 positions, salaries, and expenses necessary for the performance of the duties of
- 6 the Public Defender; requiring that attorneys-at-law employed by the Public
- 7 Defender be compensated at a rate of compensation that is comparable to the
- 8 rate of compensation of attorneys-at-law employed by the Attorney General of
- 9 Maryland; requiring that the pay rate for certain lawyers and certain
- administrative law judges be comparable to the pay rate for lawyers in the
- Office of the Attorney General; and generally relating to the budget of the Office
- of Public Defender and the compensation of attorneys-at-law, lawyers, and
- administrative law judges employed by the State.

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article 27A - Public Defender 2 3. 3 (e) The number of positions, salaries and expenses for the Office of Public 4 Defender shall be as provided in the executive budget as specified in Article III, § 52(4)(b) of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, which shall be subject to 6 approval by the General Assembly. THE BUDGET SHALL BE SUFFICIENT TO FUND 7 THE APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF POSITIONS, SALARIES, AND EXPENSES NECESSARY 8 FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF THE DUTIES OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER. THE 9 ATTORNEYS-AT-LAW EMPLOYED BY THE PUBLIC DEFENDER SHALL BE 10 COMPENSATED AT A RATE OF COMPENSATION THAT IS COMPARABLE TO THE RATE 11 OF COMPENSATION OF ATTORNEYS-AT-LAW EMPLOYED BY THE ATTORNEY 12 GENERAL OF MARYLAND. 13 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 14 8-104. 15 (1) Pay rates in the Standard Pay Plan may be set by: (a) 16 a series of pay grades and steps within each grade; (i) 17 (ii) fixed rates; or 18 (iii) minimum and maximum amounts.
