



- 2 (a) [Subject to the provisions of subsection (d) of this section, each] EACH
- 3 recipient of an Educational Excellence Award may hold the award for [5] 6 years if
- 4 the recipient:
- 5 (1) Continues to be a resident of this State;
- 6 (2) Continues to be a full-time student at an eligible institution and
- 7 takes at least 12 semester hours of courses each semester, or its equivalent as
- 8 determined by the Administration;
- 9 (3) In the judgment of the institution, is making satisfactory progress
- 10 toward a degree OR, FAILING TO DO SO, PROVIDES EVIDENCE SATISFACTORY TO THE
- 11 ADMINISTRATION OF EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES; and
- 12 (4) Maintains the standards of the institution.
- 13 (b) Each recipient of an Educational Excellence Award who is enrolled in an
- 14 associate degree program as permitted in § 18-303(b)(1) of this subtitle may hold the
- 15 award for 3 years if the same conditions of subsection (a) of this section are met.
- 16 [(c) Each recipient of an Educational Excellence Award may hold the award for 17 a 5th year if the recipient:
- 18 (1) Is enrolled in an academic program that, as determined by the
- 19 institution, requires 5 years to complete; or
- 20 (2) Provides evidence, satisfactory to the State Scholarship
