CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Homicide - Use of Deadly Force in a Business Establishment - Defense**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that a certain person who uses deadly force or force  
4 likely to cause death within the person's business establishment is presumed to  
5 have held a reasonable fear of imminent peril of death or serious physical injury  
6 to the person or an employee of the person's business establishment, if force is  
7 used against another who unlawfully and forcibly enters or has entered the  
8 person's business establishment; providing that a person is not civilly liable for  
9 any act or omission in protecting or attempting to protect the person or an  
10 employee of the person's business establishment; providing that this Act applies  
11 to an owner, lessor, or supervisory employee of a business establishment;  
12 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the use of  
13 deadly force in a business establishment.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments**

2 415A.

3 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO AN OWNER, LESSOR, OR SUPERVISORY  
4 EMPLOYEE OF A BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT.

5 (B) A PERSON WHO USES DEADLY FORCE OR FORCE LIKELY TO CAUSE DEATH  
6 WITHIN THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT IS PRESUMED TO HAVE HELD A  
7 REASONABLE FEAR OF IMMINENT PERIL OF DEATH OR SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY  
8 TO THE PERSON OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT, IF  
9 THE FORCE IS USED AGAINST ANOTHER WHO UNLAWFULLY AND FORCIBLY ENTERS  
10 OR HAS ENTERED THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT.

11 (C) A PERSON DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION IS NOT  
12 CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION IN PROTECTING OR ATTEMPTING TO  
13 PROTECT THE PERSON OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE PERSON'S BUSINESS  
14 ESTABLISHMENT.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be  
16 construed retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect any action of  
17 an owner, lessor, or supervisory employee of a business establishment occurring on or  
18 after January 1, 2001.

19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
20 October 1, 2001.
