SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Awareness Month
- 3 FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor and encouraging the United States
- 4 Congress to designate October as Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome
- 5 Awareness Month; encouraging the federal government to develop programs
- 6 relating to Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome; and generally relating to
- 7 Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome.
- 8 WHEREAS, Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome (RSDS), also known as
- 9 Complex Regional Pain Syndrome, is an extremely painful progressive chronic
- 10 disease of the nervous system resulting from a simple trauma, infection, or surgery
- 11 that can lead to chronic inflammation, spasms, burning pain, stiffness, pathological
- 12 changes in skin and bone, excessive sweating, tissue swelling, and extreme sensitivity
- 13 to touch; and
- WHEREAS, RSDS currently afflicts an estimated 7 million children and adults
- 15 in the United States and approximately 133,000 in Maryland; and
- WHEREAS, RSDS can strike at any time and is a complex and little known
- 17 disease; and
- WHEREAS, RSDS can strike at any age but is more common between the ages
- 19 of 40 and 60; and
- WHEREAS, RSDS is often misdiagnosed and treatment is delayed because it is
- 21 misdiagnosed; and
- WHEREAS, The early treatment of RSDS often results in a remission of the
- 23 disease symptoms; and

- WHEREAS, If treatment is delayed, the disorder can quickly spread causing
- 2 irreversible changes in bone and muscle and severe physical and psychological
- 3 problems; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Treatment includes multiple medications and procedures that may
- 5 be prohibitively expensive; and
- 6 WHEREAS, RSDS is recognized by the National Institute of Neurological
- 7 Disorders and Stroke which supports and conducts research relevant to RSDS; now,
- 8 therefore, be it
- 9 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the federal
- 10 government is encouraged to promote programs that will increase awareness, early
- 11 detection, research, and treatment of Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome; and
- 12 be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the United States Congress is encouraged to designate
- 14 October of each year as National Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Awareness
- 15 Month; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the Governor is requested to designate October of each year
- 17 as Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Awareness Month; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 19 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
