SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

Biotechnology Venture Capital Programs - Study

3 FOR the purpose of urging the Maryland Department of Business and Economic

- 4 Development, acting in consultation with the Maryland Bioscience Alliance and
- 5 the University of Maryland Biotechnology Institute, to study the feasibility of
- 6 establishing a State-sponsored venture capital program for biotechnology;
- 7 urging the Department to complete its study on or before a certain date and
- 8 report its written findings and legislative recommendations to the Governor and

9 the Maryland General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally

10 relating to a study of the feasibility of establishing a State-sponsored venture

11 capital program for biotechnology.

12 WHEREAS, The field of biotechnology offers great promise of:

13(1)significantly advancing health care through the development of14programs for enhancing disease prevention and diagnosis;

15 (2) extending the human life span through new pharmaceutical16 advances and innovative biomedical devices;

17 (3) improving nutrition through agricultural biotechnology; and

18 (4) ensuring a cleaner environment through environmental19 biotechnology; and

20 WHEREAS, Biotechnology creates innovative businesses and new business

21 opportunities in such areas as genomics, therapeutics, tissue engineering, gene

22 therapy, vaccines, bio-informatics, drug development, agriculture, and environmental

23 protection; and

WHEREAS, A growing biotechnology industry already exists in the State,
making substantial contributions to the State's economy; and

26 WHEREAS, There is a need to solidify the presence of a critical mass of 27 biotechnology firms to promote continued growth of this technology sector; and

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1 WHEREAS, This vital component of the State's industry often lacks access to

2 adequate venture capital because the particular needs and practices of the

3 biotechnology industry sometimes deter or discourage the traditional sources of

4 capital used by other segments of the Maryland business community; and

5 WHEREAS, Neighboring states, such as Virginia and North Carolina, have 6 successfully created and now operate state-sponsored and funded venture capital 7 programs; now, therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the 9 Maryland General Assembly urges the Maryland Economic Development Commission 10 and the Maryland Department of Business and Economic Development, acting in 11 consultation with the Maryland Bioscience Alliance and the University of Maryland 12 Biotechnology Institute, to study existing programs in this State and others, and 13 make legislative recommendations regarding, the modification of existing programs 14 and the feasibility of establishing a new State-sponsored venture capital program 15 tailored for biotechnology; and be it further

16 RESOLVED, That the study should focus on making venture capital available in 17 all regions of the State where existing and newly formed centers for biotechnology 18 research and industry are located; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That State-supported research schools, medical colleges, and 20 public-private initiatives should be invited to participate in the study; and be it 21 further

22 RESOLVED, That representatives of the biotechnology industry be invited to 23 participate in the study; and be it further

RESOLVED, That all units of the State government should participate in, and provide assistance to, the Department of Business and Economic Development whenever the Department requests participation and assistance; and be it further

27 RESOLVED, That the Department should complete its study on or before28 November 15, 2001; and be it further

29 RESOLVED, That, on or before January 9, 2002, the Department should report

30 its written findings and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of 31 the State Government Article, to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the

32 Senate Finance Committee, the House Economic Matters Committee, and the House

33 Appropriations Committee of the Maryland General Assembly; and be it further

34 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of

35 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;

36 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
