# House Bill 861

## Ways and Means

(Delegates Dembrow and Barve)

## **Education - School Accountability Funding for Excellence Program - Grants for Non- and Limited-English Proficient Students**

This bill alters the student enrollment count date for the limited English proficient program from May 15 to October 31 of a school year.

This bill takes effect July 1, 2001.

## Fiscal Summary

**State Effect:** State education aid could be minimally affected by altering the student enrollment count date used for the limited English proficient program.

**Local Effect:** State education aid to local school systems under the limited English proficient program could be minimally affected.

### **Small Business Effect:** None.

## Analysis

**Current Law:** Limited English proficient grants are based on the May 15 enrollment count in the second prior school year. For example, State aid for fiscal 2002 (2001-2002 school year) is based on the LEP count on May 15, 2000 which occurs during the 1999-2000 school year.

**State and Local Fiscal Effect:** State education aid under the limited English proficient grant program will total \$30.1 million in fiscal 2002. The LEP enrollment count as of

May 15, 2000 totaled 20,855 students. Approximately 45% of these students attend schools in Montgomery County and 27% attend schools in Prince George's County. Information is not available on whether more or fewer limited English proficient students attend school at the beginning of the school year. However, altering the student count date could impact State funding under the program. **Exhibit 1** shows the amount of State funding for this program in fiscal 2002.
