Baltimore City Parking Authority - Residential Parking Permits

This bill authorizes the Executive Director of the Baltimore City Parking Authority to issue a residential parking permit to a person who owns and occupies residential property in a residential parking permit area in Baltimore City regardless of whether the person has registered the vehicle in the State or has obtained a nonresident permit or a complimentary guest card.

The bill is effective July 1, 2001.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Issuing parking permits to persons who own and occupy residential property in a residential parking permit area could be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: A local parking authority may not issue a residential parking permit in excess of 30 days to the owner of a vehicle unless the owner provides evidence that the vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in the State or has obtained a non-resident permit from the Motor Vehicle Administration or a complimentary guest card.

Background: This bill would allow people who own second homes in Baltimore City and city residents who work for out-of-state employers and drive company cars registered in another state to obtain residential parking permits.
