Election Laws - Contribution Reports - Contributor Information

This bill requires that a campaign report submitted to the State Election Board include the full name, mailing address, employer, and occupation of the contributor where the cumulative contribution amount is greater than \$251 in a four-year election cycle. Candidates, political committee chairman, or treasurers are required to use their best efforts to obtain this information from contributors by clearly requesting the required information and timely reporting all requested information received.

State Effect: \$10,000 general fund expenditure increase in FY 2002 only for software retooling to accommodate adjusted reporting requirements. No effect on revenues.
