Election Judges - Selection Process and the Appointment of Minors

This bill expands statewide the provision, currently applicable only in Prince George's County, allowing the appointment of a minor as an election judge.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill is not expected to have a material effect on governmental operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: In Prince George's County, the local election board may provide one or more election judges who are minors. A minor at least 17 years old who is appointed to be an election judge and who is too young to be a registered voter shall demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the local board, that the minor meets all of the other qualifications for registration in the county.
