Senate Bill 692 (Senator Hollinger) Economic and Environmental Affairs

### **Agriculture - Antibiotic and Hormone Use - Reporting**

This bill requires the Secretary of Agriculture to submit a report about the use of antibiotics and hormones in agriculture to specified committees of the General Assembly and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene by October 1 of each year. The bill outlines the requirements for the report and provides that the report may not disclose the actions of any individual with respect to the use of antibiotics or hormones in agriculture.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: The bill's requirements could be handled with existing budgeted resources.

**Prior Introductions:** HB 293 of 2000, among other things, would have required the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to study the effects of the use of antibiotics and heavy metals in animal feed. The bill received an unfavorable report by the House Environmental Matters Committee.
