#### **FISCAL NOTE**

House Bill 1373 Judiciary (Delegate Montague)

### Child in Need of Assistance - Permanency Plan - Appeal of Interlocutory Order

This bill prohibits a party from appealing an interlocutory (temporary) order entered by a circuit court that amends a permanency plan for a child in need of assistance.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2001.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: This bill would not materially affect State finances.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** A party may appeal an interlocutory order entered by a circuit court in a civil case that deprives a parent, grandparent, or natural guardian of the care and custody of his child, or changes the terms of the order, regardless of whether or not the order amends a permanency plan for a child in need of assistance.
