House Bill 24 (Delegate Boschert, *et al.*)

POW/MIA Flag - Display From the State House

This bill requires that the POW/MIA flag be flown from the State House on: (1) the third Saturday in May for Armed Forces Day; (2) May 30 for Memorial Day; (3) the day that the U.S. Congress designates for the observance of Memorial Day if other than May 30; (4) the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to May 30, unless the U.S. Congress designates another day for the observance of Memorial Day, in which case the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to the day designated by the U.S. Congress; (5) June 14, for Flag Day; (6) July 4, for Independence Day; (7) the third Friday in September, for POW/MIA Recognition Day; (8) November 11, for Veteran's Day; and (9) the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to November 11, unless the U.S. Congress designates another day for the observance of Memorial Day, in which case the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to the day designated by the U.S. Congress.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The Department of General Services is responsible for flying flags from the State House. Flying another flag from the State House would have a no fiscal effect on the department. It is assumed that the cost of a flag would be less than \$100.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The POW/MIA flag is not required to be flown from the State House.
