FISCAL NOTE

House Bill 564 Judiciary (Delegates Petzold and Hecht)

Crimes - Child Abuse - Abuse by a School Employee

This bill includes "school employees" under provisions prohibiting child sexual abuse.

A school employee is defined as a paid or unpaid worker at the educational institution a child attended at the time of the abuse who within the previous year had some supervisory authority over the child.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal increase in general fund expenditures due to the bill's incarceration penalty provisions. Revenues would not be affected.

Local Effect: The bill would not materially affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Sexual abuse is defined as any act that involves sexual molestation or exploitation of a child by a parent or other person who has permanent or temporary care or custody or responsibility for supervision of a child, or by any household or family member.

A person who is convicted of child abuse, including sexual abuse of a child, is guilty of a felony and subject to a maximum term of imprisonment of 15 years. If the victim dies, the maximum term is increased to 30 years.

Background: The Division of Correction (DOC) advises that in fiscal 2000 there were 69 intakes for child abuse.

State Expenditures: General fund expenditures could increase minimally as a result of the applicable incarceration penalties due to more people being committed to DOC facilities. The number of additional people convicted as a result of the bill is expected to be minimal.

Persons serving a sentence longer than one year are incarcerated in DOC facilities. Currently, the average total cost per inmate, including overhead, is estimated at \$1,700 per month. This bill alone, however, should not create the need for additional beds, personnel, or facilities. Excluding overhead, the average cost of housing a new DOC inmate (including medical care and variable costs) is \$288 per month.
