Patients' Safety Act of 2001

This bill requires the Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC), in consultation with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH), to study the feasibility of developing a system for reducing the incidences of preventable adverse medical events in the State, including a system of reporting such incidences. MHCC must issue a preliminary report by January 1, 2002 and a final report by January 1, 2003 to the Governor, the House Economic Matters and House Environmental Matters committees, and the Senate Finance Committee on MHCC's recommendations as a result of the study.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2001.

Analysis

Current Law: None applicable.

State Fiscal Effect: MHCC special fund expenditures would increase by \$150,000 in fiscal 2002. This estimate reflects the cost of contracting with a consultant to conduct a feasibility study and develop a conceptual design plan of the proposed system. The reporting requirement could be handled with existing MHCC budgeted resources.

MHCC is specially funded through fees imposed on payors and providers. As a result of the increase in expenditures, MHCC would raise provider fees by an amount to exactly offset the increase in expenditures.

Future year expenditures and revenues would not be affected.
