House Bill 1215 (Delegate Krysiak) Economic Matters

Judicial Proceedings

Landlord and Tenant - Rent Escrow Law

This bill provides that for tenancies of one month or more, a tenant's right to escrow relief for serious and substantial defects and conditions on the leased premises is conditioned on a court not having entered three *prior* judgments for rent due and unpaid in the 12-month period prior to the initiation of the action.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not materially change State activities or operations.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: A tenant's right to escrow relief for serious and substantial defects and conditions on the leased premises is conditioned on: (1) giving proper notice, and the opportunity to correct, to the landlord; (2) the tenant's payment into court of the rent required by the lease, unless the court modifies the amount; and (3) for tenancies of one month or more, a court not having entered *more than* three judgments for rent due and unpaid in the 12-month period prior to the initiation of the action.
