House Bill 1245 (Delegate Glassman)

Commerce and Government Matters

Highways - Roundabouts - Regulations

This bill defines a traffic "roundabout" as a circular intersection that contains islands at each entrance to deflect traffic and requires entering vehicles to yield to traffic already in the intersection. It directs the State Highway Administration (SHA) to adopt regulations governing the placement and design of roundabouts on State highways and instructs the SHA to construct and maintain only those roundabouts that conform to the regulations.
