Senate Joint Resolution 15 (Senator Roesser, *et al.*) Economic and Environmental Affairs

## **Study Commission on Governmental Lobbying**

This joint resolution establishes a 13-member Study Commission on Governmental Lobbying. The commission is to report its findings, including any appropriate statutory changes, by December 31, 2001, and terminate after that date.

# Analysis

**Bill Summary:** The commission must: (1) examine the Public Ethics Law as it relates to governmental lobbying; (2) collect information about governmental lobbying practices and standards of ethics for governmental lobbyists; (3) receive testimony as the commission considers appropriate; (4) propose appropriate statutory changes to the Public Ethics Law for governmental lobbying; and (5) report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 31, 2001.

The Department of Legislative Services will provide staff for the commission.
