House Bill 116 Judiciary (Delegate Grosfeld, et al.)

Extradition - Fugitives from Justice - Bail Prohibited

This bill prohibits a person charged with committing any crime in another state and fleeing from justice from consideration for release on a bail bond.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The instances of such a person being granted bail release now are extremely rare. Accordingly, this bill is not expected to have a material impact on State operations or finances.

Local Effect: The instances of such a person being granted bail release now are extremely rare. Accordingly, this bill is not expected to have a material impact on local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: In general, the only circumstances under which such persons (charged with committing a crime in another state and fleeing from justice) are prohibited from a bail bond release in Maryland are those whereby the charge in the other state would subject the person to the death penalty or life imprisonment in that state.
