House Bill 868 (Delegate Kagan)
Commerce and Government Matters

Election Laws - Absentee Voters - Publication

This bill requires local boards of election to exclude, at the request of a voter, all information concerning an application for an absentee ballot from the voter's full record of absentee voting.

The bill is effective January 1, 2002.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: State expenditures would increase by \$1,200 in FY 2002 to upgrade the State Board of Elections' voter registration system. No effect on revenues.

Local Effect: The bill would not directly affect local government finances since local boards provide absentee ballot records to requesting voters via the State board's database.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Local boards are required to maintain a full record of absentee voting which includes an absentee voter's name, address, issue date, ballot style, and the action taken with regard to the application. The State election code also allows any registered voter to examine absentee ballot applications.

State Fiscal Effect: The State Board of Elections advises that absentee voting record information is currently stored in the database files of its central voter registration system. The State board supplies local boards with reports of absentee voting records when members of the public request them, but its voter registration database is not presently capable of keeping portions of selected absentee records confidential when it issues these reports. A one-time expenditure of \$1,200 in fiscal 2002 would be needed for upgrades to its system.
