# **Hospitals - Uniform Emergency Security Codes for Hospitals - Establishment** and **Implementation**

This bill requires the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH), in consultation with the Association of Maryland Hospitals and Health Systems and the Maryland Association of Hospital Security and Safety Directors, to develop a uniform set of emergency security codes for hospitals. Each hospital must implement the provisions of the emergency security codes within two years of DHMH's adoption of regulations.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2001.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The development of a uniform set of emergency security codes and the adoption of regulations could be handled with existing DHMH budgeted resources. No effect on revenues.
