# AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1200 (First Reading File Bill)

### AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 3, strike "Requirement" and substitute "<u>Accreditation Violations</u>"; strike beginning with "requiring" in line 4 down through "date" in line 11 and substitute "<u>prohibiting a certain licensee from violating a certain lead paint abatement accreditation requirement</u>"; in line 12, strike "training and"; in the same line, after "accreditation" insert "<u>violations</u>"; after line 12, insert:

"BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

Article - Business Regulation Section 8-301 and 8-620 Annotated Code of Maryland (1998 Replacement Volume and 2001 Supplement)";

strike in their entirety lines 13 through 17, inclusive; and in line 20, strike "8-308" and substitute "<u>8-611</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, after line 3, insert:

### "<u>8-301.</u>

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person must have a contractor license whenever the person acts as a contractor in the State.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person must have a subcontractor license or contractor license whenever the person acts as a subcontractor in the State.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person must have a salesperson license or

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contractor license whenever the person sells a home improvement in the State.

(d) This section does not apply to:

(1) <u>an individual who works for a contractor or subcontractor for a salary or</u> wages but who is not a salesperson for the contractor;

(2) <u>a clerical employee, retail clerk, or other employee of a licensed contractor</u> who is not a salesperson, as to a transaction on the premises of the licensed contractor;

(3) <u>a solicitor for a contractor who calls an owner by telephone only;</u>

(4) an architect, electrician, plumber, heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, or refrigeration contractor, or other person who:

(i) is required by State or local law to meet standards of competency or experience before engaging in an occupation or profession;

(ii) currently is licensed in that occupation or profession under State or local law; and

- <u>(iii)</u> <u>is:</u>
  - <u>1.</u> <u>acting only within the scope of that occupation or profession;</u>

or

2. installing a central heating or air-conditioning system;

(5) <u>a security systems technician licensed under Title 18 of the Business</u> Occupations and Professions Article; or

(6) <u>a person who is selling a home improvement to be performed by a person</u> <u>described in item (4) of this subsection.</u>

<u>8-611.</u>

A licensee may not violate:

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(1) <u>a building law of the State or a political subdivision of the State;</u>

- (2) <u>a safety or labor law of the State; [or]</u>
- (3) the Maryland Workers' Compensation Act; OR

(4) THE LEAD PAINT ABATEMENT ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENT UNDER § 6-1002 OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.

8-620.

(a) The Commission may impose on a person who violates this title, including § 8-607(4) of this subtitle, a civil penalty not exceeding \$5,000 for each violation, whether or not the person is licensed under this title.

- (b) In setting the amount of a civil penalty, the Commission shall consider:
  - (1) the seriousness of the violation;
  - (2) the good faith of the violator;
  - (3) any previous violations;

(4) the harmful effect of the violation on the complainant, the public, and the business of home improvement;

- (5) the assets of the violator; and
- (6) <u>any other relevant factors.</u>".

On pages 2 through 4, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 4 on page 2 through line 3 on page 4, inclusive.
