AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 423 (Third Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 3, after "<u>Care</u>" insert "<u>- Programs and</u>"; in line 10, after "distributed;" insert "<u>establishing a State Advisory Council on Pain Management</u>; specifying the membership, terms, and purpose of the Advisory Council; authorizing the Advisory Council to consult with certain individuals and organization representatives; requiring the Advisory Council to issue certain reports on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of a portion of this Act;"; in line 14, after "and" insert "<u>a State Advisory Council on Pain Management</u>"; in the same line, strike "health care facilities"; and in line 22, after "19-353" insert "<u>: and 13-601 through 13-605, inclusive, to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 16. Advisory Council on Pain Management</u>"".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, after line 3, insert:

"Preamble

WHEREAS, Estimates indicate that as many as 34 million people nationwide suffer from chronic intractable pain; and

<u>WHEREAS, Experts acknowledge that patients may be victims of inadequate pain</u> management as their needs are not met with proper treatment; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Not only is chronic intractable pain a life debilitating condition, it is a costly epidemic facing our nation; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, The field of medicine is constantly evolving, and continuing education in pain management is essential to ensure a patient is receiving the best care possible; and

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<u>WHEREAS</u>, State law and policy could play a role in facilitating effective pain management, thus serving the needs of the citizens of the State; now, therefore,".

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 3, after line 23, insert:

"SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

<u>13-1601.</u>

THERE IS A STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON PAIN MANAGEMENT.

13-1602.

- (A) (1) THE ADVISORY COUNCIL CONSISTS OF 13 MEMBERS.
 - (2) OF THE 13 MEMBERS:

(I) ONE SHALL BE A MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

(II) ONE SHALL BE A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE; AND

- (III) <u>11 SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR.</u>
- (3) OF THE 11 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:
 - (I) ONE SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT

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OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;

(II) ONE SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ATTORNEY

GENERAL;

(III) ONE SHALL BE A PHYSICIAN CERTIFIED IN PAIN

MANAGEMENT;

- (IV) ONE SHALL BE A CONSUMER;
- (V) ONE SHALL BE A DENTIST;

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- (VI) ONE SHALL BE AN ETHICIST;
- (VII) ONE SHALL BE A PHYSICIAN CERTIFIED IN GERIATRIC

MEDICINE;

(VIII) ONE SHALL BE A PEDIATRICIAN;

(IX) ONE SHALL BE A PHARMACIST; AND

(X) <u>TWO SHALL BE REGISTERED NURSES WITH EXPERTISE IN</u> HOSPICE, ONCOLOGY, LONG-TERM CARE, ANESTHESIA, OR PAIN MANAGEMENT.

(B) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 2 YEARS.

(2) IF A VACANCY OCCURS DURING THE TERM OF A MEMBER, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A SUCCESSOR WHO WILL SERVE ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL ANOTHER SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

(C) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR INCOMPETENCE OR MISCONDUCT.

<u>13-1603.</u>

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THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

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13-1604.

(A) <u>A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS SERVING ON THE ADVISORY COUNCIL</u> <u>REPRESENTS A QUORUM TO DO BUSINESS.</u>

(B) (1) THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES A YEAR, AT THE TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.

(2) <u>THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH NOTIFICATION OF THE</u> <u>MEETINGS.</u>

(C) <u>A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL:</u>

(1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT

(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(D) THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE STAFF NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS SUBTITLE.

(4) <u>ACUTE AND CHRONIC PAIN MANAGEMENT EDUCATION</u> <u>PROVIDED BY MEDICAL, NURSING, PHARMACY, AND DENTAL SCHOOLS IN THIS</u> <u>STATE;</u>

(5) ACUTE AND CHRONIC PAIN MANAGEMENT NEEDS OF BOTH ADULTS AND CHILDREN;

(6) <u>DEVELOPMENT OF A PAIN MANAGEMENT RESOURCE</u> <u>COMPENDIUM AND A PALLIATIVE CARE HOT LINE; AND</u>

(7) OTHER ISSUES RELATING TO PAIN MANAGEMENT THAT THE ADVISORY COUNCIL DEEMS APPROPRIATE.

(C) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2003, THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL ISSUE AN INTERIM REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THAT INCLUDES RECOMMENDATIONS ON PAIN MANAGEMENT ISSUES IN MARYLAND.

(2) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2004, THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL ISSUE A FINAL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THAT INCLUDES RECOMMENDATIONS ON PAIN MANAGEMENT ISSUES IN MARYLAND.".

AMENDMENT NO. 4

On page 4, strike lines 35 and 36 in their entirety; and after line 36, insert:

"<u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED</u>, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2002. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect."
