A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2	Task Force to Study Traffic Control Signal Monitoring Systems
3	FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the Use of Traffic Control
4	Signal Monitoring Systems; specifying the membership of the Task Force;
5	requiring the Governor to designate the chairman of the Task Force; requiring

- the Motor Vehicle Administration to provide staff for the Task Force; requiring 6
- 7 the Task Force to undertake a certain study; requiring the Task Force to report
- to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing 8
- 9 for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the establishment of a
- Task Force to Study the Use of Traffic Control Signal Monitoring Systems. 10
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That:
- There is a Task Force to Study the Use of Traffic Control Signal 13 (a) 14 Monitoring Systems.
- 15 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 16 (1) 17 the Senate;
- 18 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of
- 19 the House;

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- (3) the Motor Vehicle Administrator, or the Administrator's designee;
- the Secretary of the Department of State Police, or the Secretary's 21 (4)
- 22 designee; and
- 23 (5) the following members, appointed by the Governor:
- 24 (i) one representative of a company that sells or operates traffic
- 25 control signal monitoring systems; and

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- 1 (ii) one representative of a consumer highway safety organization 2 such as AAA Mid-Atlantic.

 3 (c) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Task Force.

 4 (d) The Motor Vehicle Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force.

 5 (e) The Task Force shall study the use of traffic control signal monitoring systems to enforce laws prohibiting entering an intersection against a red signal 7 indication and shall evaluate:
- 8 (1) the accuracy of such systems at identifying violators;
- 9 (2) the effectiveness of such systems in deterring violations and reducing 10 vehicular accidents;
- 11 (3) the manner in which such systems are administered by law 12 enforcement agencies; and
- 13 (4) the fee structures established to compensate persons contracted to 14 operate such systems.
- 15 (f) The Task Force shall report its findings to the Governor and, subject to § 16 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before January 17 1, 2003.
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 June 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31,
- 20 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 21 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
