7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 June 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 6 years AND 1 MONTH and, 9 at the end of [May 31, 2002] JUNE 30, 2005, with no further action required by the 10 General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 June 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 6 years AND 1 MONTH and, 14 at the end of [May 31, 2002] JUNE 30, 2005, with no further action required by the 15 General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 17 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 18 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 19 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 20 the date it is enacted.

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
