1	AN ACT concerning
2	Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities
3 4 5 6 7 8	FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities; providing for the membership, chairman, duties, and staffing of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on its findings; and generally relating to the establishment of a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance Liabilities.
9	Preamble
	WHEREAS, Maryland, like the majority of states around the country, partially subsidizes the health insurance premiums for retired State employees, and currently funds this subsidy on a "pay-as-you-go" basis; and
13 14	WHEREAS, This subsidy will grow dramatically in the future due to the growing number of State retirees and the escalation in health care costs; and
15 16	WHEREAS, The unfunded liabilities associated with this subsidy are informally estimated at \$3 billion; and
17 18	WHEREAS, To address these growing costs a growing minority of states have begun to prefund these liabilities; and
19	WHEREAS, Maryland currently has a fully funded pension system; and
20 21	WHEREAS, It is important that plans be made to ensure adequate funding for the State's subsidy of retiree health insurance; now, therefore,

- 1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That:
- 3 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the State's Retiree Health Insurance 4 Liabilities.
- 5 (b) The Task Force shall consist of the following members:
- 6 (1) three members from the House of Delegates, appointed by the 7 Speaker of the House; and
- 8 (2) three members from the Senate, appointed by the President of the 9 Senate.
- 10 (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates 11 shall jointly designate the Chairman of the Task Force.
- 12 (d) The Task Force shall:
- 13 (1) review the report prepared by the Department of Legislative
- 14 Services, included in the Joint Committee on Pensions Report of the 2000 Interim,
- 15 which included a survey of the various approaches other states have taken with
- 16 regard to the issue of retiree health care;
- 17 (2) review different approaches which address the issue of retiree health 18 care for the State and that would meet the State's needs and fiscal resources;
- 19 (3) commission an actuarial valuation of the liabilities associated with
- 20 the retiree health insurance subsidy, with the costs of the valuation to be borne by the
- 21 State Retirement and Pension System; and
- 22 (4) develop options and a recommendation to address this issue by the
- 23 start of the General Assembly's 2003 session, and evaluate the costs associated with
- 24 each option.
- 25 (e) The Task Force shall be staffed by personnel from the Department of
- 26 Legislative Services, and notice of each meeting of the Task Force shall be made
- 27 public by delivering a copy of the meeting notice to the Legislative Information
- 28 Officer, Room B-6, Department of Legislative Services, Legislative Services Building,
- 29 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401-1991, at least 10 days before any
- 30 scheduled meeting of the Task Force.
- 31 (f) The Task Force shall issue a final report of its findings and
- 32 recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government
- 33 Article, to the General Assembly by January 7, 2003.
- 34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 35 July 1, 2002.
