## **Education - High School Diplomas - Korean Conflict Veterans**

3 FOR the purpose of allowing honorably discharged veterans of the Korean Conflict to

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 (a) An individual honorably discharged from military service may apply to

17 obtain a high school diploma if the individual withdrew from a regular full-time

18 public or private school accredited by the State Board during the individual's senior

19 year in high school to enlist in the armed forces of the United States during World

20 War II OR THE KOREAN CONFLICT.

## HOUSE BILL 218

1 (b) To obtain a high school diploma under subsection (a) of this section, the 2 individual shall apply to the county board in the county where the individual resides 3 or where the school from which the individual withdrew was located.

4 (c) Each county board shall adopt rules and regulations to establish 5 procedures for awarding diplomas under this section.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 7 effect October 1, 2002.
