- 28 General of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 15-606(c) of 2 Article - Insurance of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 4 read as follows:

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Chapter 134 of the Acts of 2001

SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 3 and 4 of
this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001. On the earlier of the end of June 30, 2003, or
the availability of comparable prescription drug benefits provided by Medicare under
Title XVIII of the Social Security Act, as amended, with no further action required by
the General Assembly, [Sections] SECTION 3 [and 4] of this Act AND THE
SHORT-TERM PRESCRIPTION DRUG SUBSIDY PLAN shall be abrogated and of no
further force and effect. If comparable prescription drug benefits are provided by
Medicare under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act, the Secretary of Health and
Mental Hygiene shall notify the Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle,
Annapolis, Maryland 21401 not later than 90 days before prescription drug benefits

18 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 3 and 4 of

29 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1 and 2 of this 30 Act shall take effect July 1, 2003.

31 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in 32 Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2002.

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
