- 3 <u>UNDERSTANDING OR ANY IDENTICAL SECTION OF A SUCCESSOR MEMORANDUM OF</u>
- 4 UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE AND THE STATE.
- 5 <u>(II) BEFORE THE INSPECTION OF ANY PART OF A PUBLIC RECORD</u>
- 6 UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE
- 7 SHALL ENTER INTO A NONDISCLOSURE AGREEMENT WITH THE MARYLAND PORT
- 8 ADMINISTRATION TO ENSURE THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF THE INFORMATION
- 9 PROVIDED.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
