A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws - Leaving the Scene of an Accident Involving Serious Bodily**
3 **Injury or Death - Penalties**

4 FOR the purpose of making it a felony for a person involved in a vehicular accident
5 resulting in serious bodily injury to or death of another to leave the scene of the
6 accident under certain circumstances; providing for certain penalties for a felony
7 under this Act; defining a term; clarifying language; and generally relating to
8 the penalties for leaving the scene of an accident involving serious bodily injury
9 or death.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article - Transportation**

4 20-102.

5 (a) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily
6 injury to or death of another person immediately shall stop the vehicle as close as
7 possible to the scene of the accident, without obstructing traffic more than necessary.

8 (b) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily
9 injury to or death of another person immediately shall return to and remain at the
10 scene of the accident until the driver has complied with § 20-104 of this title.

12 (o) [(1)] Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 20-102 of this article
13 ("Driver to remain at scene -- Accidents resulting in bodily injury or death") is subject
14 to, if the accident resulted in bodily injury THAT IS NOT A SERIOUS BODILY INJURY to
15 another person, a fine of not more than \$3,000 or imprisonment for not more than 1
16 year or both.

17 [(2)] Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 20-102 of this article
18 ("Driver to remain at scene -- Accidents resulting in bodily injury or death") is subject
19 to, if the accident resulted in the death of another person, a fine of not more than
20 \$5,000 or imprisonment for not more than 5 years or both.]

22 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SERIOUS BODILY INJURY" MEANS AN INJURY THAT:

23 (1) CREATES A SUBSTANTIAL RISK OF DEATH;

24 (2) CAUSES SERIOUS PERMANENT OR SERIOUS PROTRACTED
25 DISFIGUREMENT;

26 (3) CAUSES SERIOUS PERMANENT OR SERIOUS PROTRACTED LOSS OF
27 THE FUNCTION OF ANY BODY PART, ORGAN, OR MENTAL FACULTY; OR

28 (4) CAUSES SERIOUS PERMANENT OR SERIOUS PROTRACTED
29 IMPAIRMENT OF THE FUNCTION OF ANY BODILY MEMBER OR ORGAN.

30 (B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES § 20-102 OF THIS ARTICLE ("DRIVER TO REMAIN
31 AT SCENE -- ACCIDENT RESULTING IN BODILY INJURY OR DEATH") INVOLVING AN
32 ACCIDENT THAT RESULTED IN SERIOUS BODILY INJURY TO ANOTHER PERSON, IS
33 GUILTY OF A FELONY AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT
34 MORE THAN 5 YEARS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 OR BOTH.

1 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES § 20-102 OF THIS ARTICLE ("DRIVER TO REMAIN
2 AT SCENE -- ACCIDENT RESULTING IN BODILY INJURY OR DEATH") INVOLVING AN
3 ACCIDENT THAT RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF ANOTHER PERSON, IS GUILTY OF A
4 FELONY AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN
5 10 YEARS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$10,000 OR BOTH.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2002.
