- 2 Public Utilities - Natural Gas Companies - Natural Gas Universal Service 3 **Program**
- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to establish a certain
- 5 natural gas universal service program; requiring all customers of natural gas
- 6 companies in the State to contribute to the funding of a natural gas universal
- 7 service program; providing for certain funding of a universal service program;
- 8 requiring certain actions by the General Assembly regarding certain funding of
- 9 the universal service program; requiring the Commission to report to the
- General Assembly on a natural gas universal service program annually and 10
- make a certain recommendation; and generally relating to the natural gas 11
- 12 universal service program.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- **Article Public Utility Companies** 20
- 21 7-608.
- 22 THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH A NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL (A) (1)
- 23 SERVICE PROGRAM TO ASSIST NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS WITH ANNUAL INCOMES
- 24 AT OR BELOW 150% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL.
- THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE 25 (2)
- 26 FOR ADMINISTERING THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM THROUGH
- 27 THE MARYLAND ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

- 1 (3) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL ADMINISTER THE
- 2 NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM IN THE SAME MANNER AS IS SET
- 3 FORTH FOR THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM FOR ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS IN §
- 4 7-512.1 OF THIS TITLE.
- 5 (4) WITH INPUT FROM A PANEL OR ROUNDTABLE OF INTERESTED
- 6 PARTIES, THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES MAY CONTRACT WITH A
- 7 FOR-PROFIT OR NONPROFIT MARYLAND CORPORATION EXISTING AS OF JULY 1, 2002
- 8 TO ASSIST IN ADMINISTERING THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM.
- 9 (5) THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE OVERSIGHT RESPONSIBILITY FOR 10 THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM.
- 11 (6) THE COMPONENTS OF THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE 12 PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE:
- 13 (I) BILL ASSISTANCE, AT A MINIMUM OF 50% OF THE DETERMINED

14 NEED;

- 15 (II) LOW-INCOME WEATHERIZATION; AND
- 16 (III) THE RETIREMENT OF ARREARAGES THAT WERE INCURRED 17 BEFORE THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION DATE.
- 18 (B) (I) (I) ALL CUSTOMERS WILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE FUNDING OF THE
- 19 NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM THROUGH A CHARGE COLLECTED BY
- 20 EACH NATURAL GAS COMPANY.
- 21 (II) IN THE FIRST 6 MONTHS AFTER THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION
- 22 DATE, THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER ADJUSTMENTS TO THE CHARGES
- 23 COLLECTED FOR THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM FOR PERSONS
- 24 WHO ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR CUSTOMER CHOICE.
- 25 (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE A FAIR AND EQUITABLE
- 26 ALLOCATION FOR COLLECTING THE CHARGES AMONG ALL CUSTOMER CLASSES
- 27 UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION.
- 28 (3) ANY UNEXPENDED NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM
- 29 FUNDS RETURNED TO CUSTOMERS UNDER SUBSECTION (H) OF THIS SECTION SHALL
- 30 BE RETURNED TO CUSTOMER CLASSES IN THE SAME PROPORTIONS AS THEY WERE
- 31 COLLECTED.
- 32 (4) A GAS COMPANY SHALL RECOVER NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL
- 33 SERVICE PROGRAM COSTS TO THE EXTENT THE COMMISSION FINDS THE COSTS TO
- 34 BE JUST AND REASONABLE.
- 35 (5) THE COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE THE ALLOCATION OF THE
- 36 NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE CHARGE AMONG THE PRODUCTION,
- 37 TRANSMISSION, AND DISTRIBUTION RATE COMPONENTS OF ALL CLASSES.

- 1 (C) STARTING IN 2003, ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE
- 2 COMMISSION SHALL REPORT, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
- 3 ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE
- 4 PROGRAM, INCLUDING:
- 5 (1) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTIONS (D) AND (E) OF THIS SECTION, A
- 6 RECOMMENDATION ON THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDS FOR THE PROGRAM FOR THE
- 7 FOLLOWING FISCAL YEAR;
- 8 (2) FOR BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE:
- 9 (I) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF NEED, AS DETERMINED BY THE
- 10 COMMISSION, FOR NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS WITH ANNUAL INCOMES AT OR BELOW
- 11 150% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL AND THE BASIS FOR THIS DETERMINATION;
- 12 AND
- 13 (II) THE PERCENTAGE OF NEED, AS DETERMINED BY THE
- 14 COMMISSION, BUT AT A MINIMUM OF 50%, THAT SHOULD BE FUNDED THROUGH THE
- 15 NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM AND THE BASIS FOR THIS
- 16 DETERMINATION;
- 17 (3) FOR LOW-INCOME WEATHERIZATION. THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS
- 18 NEEDED, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, FOR MEASURES THAT REDUCE
- 19 CONSUMPTION OF ENERGY BY NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS WITH ANNUAL INCOMES
- 20 AT OR BELOW 150% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL AND THE BASIS FOR THIS
- 21 DETERMINATION;
- 22 (4) THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS NEEDED, AS DETERMINED BY THE
- 23 COMMISSION, TO RETIRE ARREARAGES THAT WERE INCURRED BEFORE THE INITIAL
- 24 IMPLEMENTATION DATE BY NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS WITH ANNUAL INCOMES AT
- 25 OR BELOW 150% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL AND THE BASIS FOR THIS
- 26 DETERMINATION;
- 27 (5) THE IMPACT ON CUSTOMERS' RATES, INCLUDING THE ALLOCATION
- 28 AMONG CUSTOMER CLASSES, FROM COLLECTING THE TOTAL AMOUNT
- 29 RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMISSION UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND
- 30 (6) THE IMPACT OF USING OTHER FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL
- 31 BENCHMARKS ON COSTS AND THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE NATURAL GAS
- 32 UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM.
- 33 (D) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDS TO BE COLLECTED FOR THE NATURAL GAS
- 34 UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM IN EACH OF THE 3 YEARS AFTER THE INITIAL
- 35 IMPLEMENTATION DATE SHALL BE \$34,000,000, ALLOCATED IN THE FOLLOWING
- 36 MANNER:
- 37 (1) \$24,400,000 SHALL BE COLLECTED FROM THE INDUSTRIAL AND
- 38 COMMERCIAL CLASSES; AND
- 39 (2) \$9,600,000 SHALL BE COLLECTED FROM THE RESIDENTIAL CLASS.

- 3 BEGINNING WITH THE FOURTH YEAR AFTER THE IMPLEMENTATION DATE.
- 4 (2) THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSION MAY ONLY BE MADE 5 AFTER CONSIDERATION OF:
- 6 (I) INFORMATION RELATED TO THE FUNDING FOR THE FIRST 3 7 YEARS OF THE PROGRAM;
- 8 (II) THE RETIREMENT, DURING THE FIRST 3 YEARS, OF
- 9 ARREARAGES INCURRED BEFORE THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION DATE; AND
- 10 (III) THE AMOUNT OF LOW-INCOME ASSISTANCE INCLUDED IN 11 RATES BEFORE THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION DATE.
- 12 (F) FOR EACH YEAR, BEGINNING WITH THE FOURTH YEAR AFTER THE INITIAL
- 13 IMPLEMENTATION DATE, THE AMOUNT TO BE USED FOR THE NATURAL GAS
- 14 UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM, DETERMINED AFTER CONSIDERATION OF THE
- 15 RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSION REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION, IS
- 16 SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THROUGH THE
- 17 ENACTMENT OF LEGISLATION.
- 18 (G) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, FOR THE 3
- 19 YEARS IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION DATE, NATURAL
- 20 GAS SUPPLIERS AND NATURAL GAS COMPANIES MAY NOT TERMINATE, FOR AN
- 21 ARREARAGE BALANCE DUE ON THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION DATE, THE SUPPLY
- 22 OF NATURAL GAS TO A CUSTOMER WHO RECEIVES ASSISTANCE UNDER THE
- 23 NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 24 (H) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL 25 SERVICE PROGRAM FUND.
- 26 (2) THERE IS A NATURAL GAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM FUND.
- 27 (3) (I) 1. THE COMPTROLLER SHALL COLLECT THE REVENUE
- 28 COLLECTED BY NATURAL GAS COMPANIES UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION
- 29 AND PLACE THE REVENUE INTO THE FUND.
- 30 2. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE FUNDS
- 31 SUPPLEMENTAL TO THE FUNDS COLLECTED UNDER SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH 1 OF THIS
- 32 SUBPARAGRAPH.
- 33 (II) THE FUND IS A CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT
- 34 SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.
- 35 (III) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO ASSIST NATURAL GAS
- 36 CUSTOMERS AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION.

## **HOUSE BILL 268**

- 1 (4) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, WITH OVERSIGHT BY 2 THE COMMISSION, SHALL DISBURSE THE FUNDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 3 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- 4 (5) IN ANY YEAR WHEN THERE ARE UNEXPENDED FUNDS, THOSE 5 FUNDS SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE CUSTOMER CLASSES IN THE PROPORTION THAT 6 THE CUSTOMER CLASSES CONTRIBUTED TO THE FUND.
- 7 (6) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 8 COMMISSION MAY RETAIN ANY UNEXPENDED FUNDS IN THE FUND AT THE END OF 9 JUNE 30, 2004 AND MAKE THE FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR DISBURSEMENT THROUGH 10 JUNE 30, 2005 TO ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS WHO:
- 11 QUALIFY FOR ASSISTANCE FROM THE FUND DURING FISCAL 12 YEAR 2004; AND
- 13 (II) APPLY FOR ASSISTANCE FROM THE FUND BEFORE JULY 1, 2004.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2002.
