By: Delegates Branch and Owings Introduced and read first time: January 23, 2002 Assigned to: Environmental Matters Committee Report: Favorable with amendments House action: Adopted Read second time: March 23, 2002 CHAPTER 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Public Utilities - Natural Gas Companies - Natural Gas Universal Service 3 **Program Task Force** 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to establish establishing a Natural Gas Universal Service Program Task Force to study the possible 5 establishment of a certain natural gas universal service program; requiring all 6 customers of natural gas companies in the State to contribute to the funding of 7 8 a natural gas universal service program; providing for certain funding of a 9 universal service program; requiring certain actions by the General Assembly 10 regarding certain funding of the universal service program; requiring the Commission to report to the General Assembly on a natural gas universal 11 service program annually and make a certain recommendation providing for the 12 membership, charge, and responsibilities of the Task Force; requiring the Public 13 14 Service Commission to provide staff support for the Task Force; requiring the 15 Task Force to report to certain persons by a certain date; providing for the 16 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the study of a possible natural gas universal service program. 17 18 BY adding to Article - Public Utility Companies 19 20 Section 7-608 21 Annotated Code of Maryland 22 (1998 Volume and 2001 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- **HOUSE BILL 268** 1 FOR THE TASK FORCE IN AN EFFORT TO ACHIEVE DIVERSITY OF GEOGRAPHICAL 2 REPRESENTATION OF THE STATE ON THE TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG ITS (3) 4 MEMBERS. 5 <u>(4)</u> A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE: MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE TASK 6 (I)7 FORCE: BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 8 (II)9 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS.
