AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health 9 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the 10 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take 11 effect from the date it is enacted.
