1 AN ACT concerning

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Security Council within the Executive 4 Department; specifying the membership and terms of the members of the 5 Council; specifying the terms of certain initial members of the Council; 6 providing for the compensation of Council members; providing for a Director of 7 the Council and staff support for the Council; requiring the Council to meet at 8 certain times; specifying the duties of the Council; requiring certain personnel to 9 cooperate with the Council under certain circumstances; requiring the Council 10 to submit a certain report; defining certain terms; making this Act an 11 emergency measure; and generally relating to the establishment of a the 12 Maryland Security Council.

- 21 appointed members of the Maryland Security Council shall expire as follows:
- 22 (1) two members in 2003;
- 23 (2) two members in 2004; and
- 24 (3) three members in 2005.
- 25 SECTION-2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an
- 26 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
- 27 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the
- 28 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
- 29 effect from the date it is enacted.
