CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Infants and Toddlers Act of 2002

FOR the purpose of renaming a certain statewide interagency system of 3

comprehensive early intervention services for certain infants and toddlers to be 4

5 the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program; providing for the purpose of the

Program; requiring the Maryland State Department of Education to distribute 6

7 funds to counties for the Program according to a certain formula; requiring the

8 State to provide a certain percentage of the funds for the Program in certain

9 years; requiring the State Department of Education to submit a certain report

10 on the Program by a certain date; requiring the Governor to include a certain

- 1 amount in certain State budgets for the Program *subject to a certain condition in*
- 2 certain years; requiring the State Department of Education to submit a certain
- 3 <u>report on the Program by a certain date</u>; and generally relating to the Maryland
- 4 Infants and Toddlers Program.

Preamble

WHEREAS, Brain research confirms that the most rapid brain developmentoccurs in the first three years of life; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has recognized the immediate need foreffective strategies to prepare all children to enter school ready to learn; and

WHEREAS, The National Academy of Sciences concludes that the course ofdevelopment for young children can be altered by effective early interventions; and

17 <u>WHEREAS, A key component of effective early intervention is the Program of</u>
 18 <u>Hearing-Impaired Infants; and</u>

19 WHEREAS, The Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program provides effective,

20 integrated services to young children from birth through age two three who

21 demonstrate a 25% delay in development, have a diagnosed condition with a high

22 probability of delay, or demonstrate atypical development or behavior; and

WHEREAS, Early intervention services are provided in a child's natural
environment, such as home, child care settings, and community learning centers; and

WHEREAS, Early intervention services and strategies are modeled for parents and caregivers so that development may continue in the child's daily living routines; and

WHEREAS, An Individualized Family Service Plan is implemented to assist with the needs of the family, as well as the young child receiving services; and

30 WHEREAS, The number of children and families receiving services from the 31 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program has increased 30% since 1995, with the State 32 appropriation remaining at \$400,000 since fiscal year 1997; and

WHEREAS, The current level of available federal, State, and local funds is insufficient to provide early intervention services to the steadily increasing number of infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families in compliance with Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and COMAR 13A.13.01; and

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WHEREAS, 24% of the young children receiving early intervention through the
 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program in 2000 required no special education
 services at age three; now, therefore,

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 [(a) The Department shall be the lead agency for supervising and monitoring a 9 statewide, community-based interagency system of comprehensive early intervention 10 services to eligible infants and toddlers, birth through age 2, and their families.]

11 (A) (1) THERE IS A MARYLAND INFANTS AND TODDLERS PROGRAM IN THE 12 DEPARTMENT.

(2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE A STATEWIDE,
 COMMUNITY-BASED INTERAGENCY SYSTEM OF COMPREHENSIVE EARLY
 INTERVENTION SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE INFANTS AND TODDLERS, BIRTH THROUGH
 AGE 2, AND THEIR FAMILIES.

17 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE THE LEAD AGENCY FOR SUPERVISING AND 18 MONITORING THE PROGRAM.

19 [(b)] (C) The [interagency system] PROGRAM shall include the early

20 intervention services provided or supervised by THE DEPARTMENT AND the State

21 Departments of Health and Mental Hygiene <u>INCLUDING THE PROGRAM FOR</u>

22 HEARING-IMPAIRED INFANTS ESTABLISHED UNDER TITLE 13, SUBTITLE 6 OF THE

23 HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE[, Human Resources, and Juvenile Justice,] AND

24 HUMAN RESOURCES, and the Office for Children, Youth, and Families.

[(c)] (D) The [interagency system of early intervention services] PROGRAM
shall be administered in accord with the applicable requirements of [Federal Public
Law 99-457] PART C OF THE INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES EDUCATION ACT and
other applicable federal and State laws.

29 [(d)] (E) An interagency coordinating council shall be appointed by the 30 Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and shall:

31 (1) Advise and assist the Department in the supervision and monitoring 32 of the [interagency system of early intervention services] PROGRAM; and

33 (2) Submit an annual report to the Governor and the federal34 government.

35 [(e)] (F) Local lead agencies shall be established or designated in each county

36 and Baltimore City to administer the [interagency system of early intervention

37 services] PROGRAM in their subdivision, under the direction of the Department.

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1 [(f)] (G) In each county, the county executive or county commissioners, (1)2 as appropriate, or in Baltimore City, the Mayor shall establish a local interagency 3 coordinating council to advise and assist the local lead agency in the development and 4 implementation of policies that constitute the local [early intervention system] 5 PROGRAM. 6 In each county, the county executive or county commissioners, (2)(i) 7 as appropriate, or in Baltimore City, the Mayor may designate the local management 8 board to serve as the local interagency coordinating council or establish the local 9 interagency coordinating council as a part of that board. 10 Where a local management board and a local interagency (ii) 11 coordinating council coexist, they shall work cooperatively. 12 (H) (1)FOR FISCAL YEAR 2004 2005 2004, THE ANNUAL PER CHILD COST OF 13 THE PROGRAM IS \$4,044 \$4,165 \$4,044. 33 General Assembly that the Governor shall include an appropriation in the State

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34 budget for fiscal year 2003 2004 for the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program of at

35 least \$5,200,000 <u>\$680,000</u>. In addition to any funds appropriated in fiscal year 2003

- 2 the State budgets for fiscal year 2004 2005 and each fiscal year thereafter for the
- 3 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program an appropriation that is sufficient to fund
- 4 the grants required under § 8-416 of the Education Article as amended by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland State
- 6 Department of Education shall conduct a study of the effectiveness of the Maryland
- 7 Infants and Toddlers Program enacted by this Act and shall submit a report to the
- 8 Governor and, in accordance with § 2 1246 of the State Government Article, the
- 9 General Assembly on or before December 15, 2005, with recommendations on
- 10 whether: (1) the program should be continued or modified; and (2) funding for the 11 program should be modified or should increase in fiscal years 2007 and 2008 and
- 12 thereafter as provided in § 8 416(h) of the Education Article, as amended by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland State
- 14 Department of Education shall conduct a study of the effectiveness of the Maryland
- 15 Infants and Toddlers Program enacted by this Act and shall submit a report to the
- 16 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the
- 17 General Assembly on or before December 15, 2005, with recommendations on:
- 18 (1) whether the Program should be continued or modified; and
- 19 (2) whether the funding for the Program as provided in § 8-416(h) of the
- 20 *Education Article as enacted by this Act, should be modified in fiscal year 2006 and* 21 *thereafter.*
- 22 SECTION 3. <u>4.</u> <u>2.</u> <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall 23 take effect July 1, 2002.
