HOUSE BILL 395

- 1 THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A DISABILITY RETIREE WHO IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO 2 RECEIVE A NORMAL SERVICE RETIREMENT. 3 The retiree shall be examined by a physician chosen by the Board of 4 Trustees at a place agreed on by the retiree and the physician conducting the 5 examination. 6 If a retiree who is under normal retirement age refuses a medical (c) 7 examination, the Board of Trustees may stop payment of the retiree's allowance until 8 the retiree withdraws the refusal. 9 If a retiree's refusal of a medical examination continues for 1 year, the (d) 10 Board of Trustees may revoke the retiree's rights in the retiree's disability retirement 11 allowance. 12 (e)1 The Board of Trustees may, after giving notice [and an opportunity 13 for a hearing], TEMPORARILY suspend the retiree's allowance if [THE RETIREE: 14 BEGAN RECEIVING A DISABILITY RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE ON (i)] 15 OR AFTER JULY 1, 1998; AND a retiree is employed by a participating employer at an annual 16 (II)17 compensation that is at least equal to the retiree's average final compensation at 18 retirement [; 19 (ii) a retiree is employed by a participating employer at an annual 20 compensation that is less than the retiree's average final compensation at retirement 21 in a position similar to the position held before retirement; or 22 (iii) the Board of Trustees determines that a retiree has refused to 23 accept from the retiree's employer at retirement an offer of reemployment in a 24 position comparable to the position held before retirement or a position with 25 compensation that is at least equal to the retiree's average final compensation at 26 retirement]. 27 A retiree whose allowance is TEMPORARILY suspended under this (2) 28 subsection [may receive a vested allowance as provided under Title 29, Subtitle 3 of 29 this article, if the retiree had at least 5 years of eligibility service at retirement] IS 30 NOT SUBJECT TO A REDUCTION AS PROVIDED IN § 29-116 OF THIS SUBTITLE DURING 31 THE PERIOD OF EMPLOYMENT BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER. UPON RECEIVING SATISFACTORY DOCUMENTATION THAT THE 32 (3) 33 RETIREE IS NO LONGER EMPLOYED BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER. THE BOARD OF 34 TRUSTEES SHALL REINSTATE THE RETIREE'S ALLOWANCE WITH ACCUMULATED
- 35 COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS FROM THE DATE THE ALLOWANCE WAS
- 36 TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED.
- 37 THE RETIREE'S ALLOWANCE WILL BE REINSTATED ON THE FIRST
- 38 DAY OF THE MONTH FOLLOWING THE MONTH IN WHICH THE RETIREE CEASED
- 39 EMPLOYMENT WITH THE PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER.
